Five blind men visited the king's court. "This is the king's elephant," someone explained. Eager fingers stretched out to learn what this thing might be.

One man laid his hand on the animal's broad side and concluded the king's elephant must be a wall. The second felt a leg, which was certainly much like a tree. Touching the tail, the third knew the object resembled a rope. The fourth felt the trunk and called it a snake; and the last, stroking the sharp tusk, was sure that an elephant was similar to a spear.

"Wall...tree...rope...snake...spear!" Each man knew what he had experienced and scorned the others for their lack of understanding. Their opinions were contradictory because none had experienced the whole of the great beast; yet, to a limited extent, each contained truth.

Among Christians, we find much diversity. We are warned of false teachings, and we pray for guidance and discernment. At Westminster Presbyterian Church, devout, loving Christians influence us; but the only insights we can truly claim as our own are the revelations God opens our hearts and minds to receive.

Like the sightless men in the old story, we may be tempted to discredit others who are blind to spiritual truths obvious to us. As we hold our own faith, perhaps we should guard against smugness. Should we not speak kindly about all God's beloved? No human mind can fully comprehend the infinite God. Could it be possible that to different seekers God has revealed different aspects of His nature? Might we learn from some whose views are different from our own?

Perhaps in our future reality, we will more fully know the God we serve. Perhaps then, among all His children, we will experience a unity we do not now perceive.
