EASTER MORNING

Easter Sunday is a special time for all Christians. But, growing up in the Moravian Church in North Carolina, Easter Sunday was even more significant because of the Sunrise Service held in Old Salem. It has been held each and every Easter since 1772, but it is more - both from place and timing - than simply a sunrise service.

Central to the service of true worship, with no sense of pageantry or spectacular appeal, is the music and the accompaniment by the massed church bands (each congregation has one), some 500 musicians (more about that later).

The Sunrise Service informally begins about 2:00 AM Easter morning as the congregational bands move from their respective churches into the surrounding neighborhoods and play chorales, partly to remind all listeners of the Resurrection and, partly, to awaken people for the Sunrise Service. The first chorale played is "Sleepers, Wake!" After completing the neighbor sojourns, the bands assemble at Home Moravian Church in Old Salem to prepare for the service.

The service formally begins in the Town Square of Old Salem and spreads beyond its boundaries into the ultimate destination - God's Acre - the Moravian graveyard called by its ancient and significant name (God's Acre - a "field" in which the bodies of loved ones are sown as "physical bodies" in due time to be raised as "spiritual bodies").

As dawn approaches, thousands of worshipers of all denominations gather in the Town Square, with great anticipation, awaiting the proclamation, "The Lord is risen!" Thus begins a service of profession of faith using a special Easter Morning Liturgy while 500 +/- band members accompany the singing of hymns by playing antiphonally (call and response). The congregation processes a short distance from the Town Square to God's Acre where the saints who went before await resurrection. Facing east as the sun rises, the congregation sings of Christ's triumph over death, sin and the power of evil.

This service, without pomp or pageantry, reawakens our souls to the power of the Resurrection. The joyous celebration in the still morning draws us even closer to the reality of Jesus' victory over death and the promise of salvation for each of us.

The memories of these services over many years of my youth and my participation as a member of the band greatly strengthened my faith in Christ. Years later (as in now), participation as a member of the Sanctuary Choir continues the tradition of music and its meaning in worship for me, especially in the joyous celebration of this special day. You might even say that the singing of the "Hallelujah Chorus" is our own way of assembling the bands for worship today.

We all have memories from our youth that tie us to today. Let those traditions strengthen us as we celebrate the Resurrection.

As we go about our way on this glorious day, let us remember, simply:
 "The Lord is risen!" "He is risen! Indeed!"
