To me, the laying on of hands by elders has always been a powerful symbol of support and love. As our new elders receive the blessing of laying on of hands, let each member of our Westminster family feel God's Spirit surrounding us all in this Lenten season and new beginning.

Let us join together in determining God's will for this particular family of faith and send that message to the Greenville community and the world beyond. We are a loving and forgiving church, one that thinks, acts, loves and forgives like Jesus. Our leaders will show the way.
