**"WHERE THERE IS NO VISION,
 THE PEOPLE PERISH"
 Proverbs 29:18**

The vision referred to in this Proverb refers to a sight which goes beyond our physical capacity to see. We are all familiar with the famous speech of Martin Luther King, as he stood before the crowd and declared, "I have a dream!" He proceeded to share his dream, his vision, of the kind of country America could be. His dream, his vision, gave people hope. It gave people direction. It gave people inspiration and purpose for living.

What is this vision we need? When we speak of a vision for ourselves and our community, we are talking about a picture of a desired future. This vision is not seeing things as they are, but as they will be. The word "perish" has sometimes been translated as undisciplined or unrestrained. As this word is used in the Proverb, it has the connotation of letting something slip through your fingers by ignoring an opportunity. In other words, without a clear vision to direct us, we fail in the most miserable of ways. We are reduced to lost opportunity, going nowhere important. The kind of vision we need is a vision which will give us purpose and guidance for our lives.

We must not only be willing to see the vision, but to act on it. In order to experience the power of vision, we must see our personal vision and order our lives by it. A Japanese proverb tells us that, "*Vision without action is a daydream. Action without vision is a nightmare.*" We must have the vision and then do something about it.

Helen Keller became ill as a young child, ending up both deaf and blind. She did not let those conditions keep her down. She graduated from college, and became an author and lecturer. Helen Keller's life and work served as an inspiration for all. While she did not have the capacity for physical sight, she did have the kind of vision we have been talking about. Read these words from Helen Keller:

*"I am only one; but still I am one.
 I cannot do everything, but still I can something.
 I will not refuse to do the something I can do."*

Let us find that vision and then do as Helen Keller did -- do the something we can do.
