"I brought him in as soon as I could after I saw it! So, he's gonna be OK, right?" the young newlywed wailed in my office. I was in my first year of residency training in dermatology, and yet even I could tell that the lesion she was talking about on her young marine husband was very, very bad. She was taking on the responsibility of being a good wife at the tender age of 18, and she was doing a very good job. I remember that day as if it were yesterday: Her pleading voice begging me to tell her that everything was going to be OK. My feeling of helplessness knowing that despite her doing the right thing, her husband did indeed have a melanoma skin cancer and their lives would at the very least, be changed forever. The age-old question of "why do bad things happen to good people" came up that day as it does whenever I see another patient with a melanoma, hear about deaths in a hurricane, tornado, earthquake, automobile accidents or other tragedies. Then I ask myself, would I feel any different if I knew that the people who befell the tragedy were bad? The fact is that good things happen to good people and good things happen to bad people, just like bad things happen to good people, and bad things happen to bad people. The question then becomes: "Why be good if I am not going to be rewarded any more than a bad person, or why not be bad if I am not going to be punished any more than a good person?" The answer to me is that we need to try to always ask ourselves "what would Jesus do?" We should try to be good not because we will get some type of reward, but because it is the right thing to do! At the same time we should understand that just because we are good, does not mean that we are going to be protected from a bad thing happening to us. Just like sunshine, good things happen to everyone, good and bad alike, and just like the rain, bad things happen to everyone. Realizing this helps me to accept it a little better when bad news comes calling.
