WORSHIP BAGS

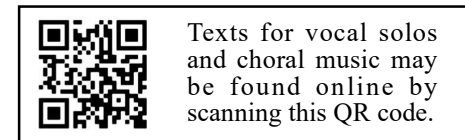

From the Pews, Parks Workman

Micah 6 poses profound questions for us in the context of a metaphorical cosmic trial. The Lord asks, "Oh my people, what have I done to you?" For me, the answer could never be captured in words. Even beyond the countless miracles of our lives, there is the infinite grace we have received in Jesus. "With what shall I come before the Lord?" This is a difficult question for wondering minds. The infinite grace of Jesus continues regardless of our shortcomings. Yet how should we respond?

Recently, the Spirit has worked through this church to send me a few reminders. First, I had the pleasure of teaching Sunday School to the 5-and-6-year-olds this past week. It had been a while since I had taught this age group. However, the experience reminded me of the incredible insight that children can provide to a questioning soul. We learned that we can show love for Jesus by "feeding sheep." The children got it immediately and described numerous acts of service for others. Through these 5-and-6-year-olds, the Spirit reminded me to keep it simple: look outwardly and serve others.

Second, there is this Harbinger cover, leading me to spend time with Micah. Here, God shows the many ways we can get lost, but also provides hope and direction for us: Do justice. Love kindness. Walk humbly with God.

Again, this points our response to Jesus outward, not inward. It is through our service to others, this church, our community, sometimes in ways contrary to the needs of our self-serving ego, that we can walk with God.

It can be far too easy to stay comfortable in the many ways our self-serving nature takes us. Who can take on yet another obligation? How does this interfere with my plans, my responsibilities?

Let's keep it simple. Let's find a single finite act of service we can do for others, then find the next, then find the next. If our eyes are open, there will be many steps we can take with God every day. Our finite acts of service, whether large or small, can collectively provide a reflection of the infinite grace of Jesus. Let's demonstrate our love for Jesus by embodying justice, kindness, and humility in our interactions with others, walking alongside Him in service and grace.
