The Bible is filled with metaphors of God being like a mother and father. The most basic human need of all is the love and care that parents give their children. Without that care and attention we would not survive.

Parenting for me has provided a glimpse into God's heart. I understand loving in a different and deeper way. There are moments of sheer joy and moments of feeling overwhelmed and inadequately prepared.

I have the blessing of several mother figures in my life. Each have played an important part in my journey and each have brought different strengthens to speak into my life. Today's scripture reading from Psalms reminds me of my maternal

grandmother. She was known for being loving and direct. Her words were "telling

Reading from The Message - Psalms 1:1- 6: "How well must God like you you don't hang at Sin Saloon, you don't slink along Dead-End Road, you don't go to Smart-Mouth College. Instead you thrill to God's Word, you chew on Scripture day and night. You're a tree replanted in Eden, bearing fresh fruit every month, never dropping a leaf, always in blossom. You're not at all like the wicked, who are mere windblown dust – without defense in court, unfit for innocent people. God charts the road you take. The road they take is Skid Row."

My grandmother had very similar advice. She would remind us that we needed to make life decisions that reflected our Christian values and that required making unpopular decisions sometimes. She also loved unconditionally and was the first to welcome you back from a slight turn down "skid row" or in my case a few visits to

As we celebrate our Confirmation Sunday, let us be reminded as a congregation that we have promised to help love, shepherd and guide this class today along their journey. We pray that you seek His parental guidance to avoid "Sin Saloon, Dead-End Roads and Smart-Mouth College" AND, if you also find yourself taking a turn off the charted map, know that Westminster will welcome you back with loving
