

own That said, what we do with our time, treasure and energy matters too. A poet once wrote, "Life is real! Life is earnest! And the grave is not its goal." It's doubtful that Longfellow had the people of the church of Corinth in mind when he wrote this, but if he had, he might well have told them that through their earthly lives and actions they could cause God's glory to spread.

As the story goes, three workers were at toil on a job site. Each of them was asked what they were doing. The first answered flatly, "I'm laying bricks." The second replied, "I'm bricking a building." The third though proclaimed enthusiastically, "I'm building the house of God!"

In today's Old Testament reading, we find David in peril, taking refuge in a cave, praising God and asking for mercy. In the New Testament reading, Paul encourages the reader to not lose heart in the face of light and momentary troubles, but to fix their eyes on what is important – God's eternal glory.

I am fond of saying that 'everybody has something'-something that they're struggling with. Often, we have a bunch of somethings, but always something, nonetheless. At times those somethings don't seem light or momentary but seem like they are too much or that they will consume us or those we love. We feel we won't escape the cave.

Having spent time in the cave, Paul's words are hard for me to hear, as hard for us to hear today as they likely were for the Corinthians. We worry and stress over what are seemingly big somethings in our lives. But we also struggle every day in the minutia – slowly building lives, building families, careers. All these things, a million little pieces, that through time, perseverance and grace, we hope will add up to big, seemingly important things. Yet, the rules of the game provide that all that is wagered is temporary and that in the end it is swallowed up - game, player, all.

So what's the point?

Believe it or not, this existential question was covered recently in the 5th and 6th grade Sunday School class. All the tough questions get asked in the 5th and 6th grade Sunday School class. This one (I think) got answered. In the class, we had developed a list. A list of rules to live by, things to keep in mind, the important stuff. The list comes directly from the words of Jesus, from Jean Weaver's sermon on what Jesus may have scratched in the dust after saving the woman from stoning, and from Grayson White imploring us to think more about others and be less selfish. It's a good list, organic,

The most recent two entries on the list are simple, but they apply here. They go like this -(1) keep faith; (2) do good things too.
