WHERE DID THE TIME GO?

A big milestone was passed in my life about a year ago when I turned 60. That was quickly followed by our son's 18th birthday and the marriage of our daughter.

That caused me to ponder time and how it accelerates through life. It truly seems like yesterday I was holding Rachel (born 7 weeks early) in my arms in the NICU at Greenville Memorial Hospital. And didn't we just pick up Robby from his first day at Westminster's Weekday School?

Where are the brakes in life? I don't act like I'm 61 and I don't feel like I'm 61 (although my arthritic right knee would beg to differ), but life seems to be rushing by like one of those bullet trains we saw in Italy last summer: Blink and it's gone.

Many of us say we want life to slow down, but we get so caught up in "stuff" that we fail to take it all in. Daily worries shade our eyes and distract us.

As always, Jesus addresses those concerns. Toward the end of his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells us to unburden ourselves of worry.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?" Matthew 6:25-34

I think what Jesus meant was for us to stop and experience life. That's really what his time among us was all about. Through Him, God was able to see what our lives were like. Through Jesus, God was able to show us a path, a light to follow.

So cherish those little moments: The artwork your preschooler is so proud of; the hard work your spouse does to create a wonderful home; the prayers you say together as a family. These moments seem like they will always be around. But 61 years on God's creation has shown me they are fleeting.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, we are so grateful for this life you've given us. Help us to cherish the small moments and trust your Son for the big picture. Amen.
