GENUINE LOVE AND KINDNESS

In Acts 5:1-11 we read of a married couple, Ananias and Sapphira, selling a piece of property and publicly announcing their donation of the proceeds to the community. However, they secretly hold back a portion of the money for themselves. When Peter detects the deception he confronts the two separately. Simply hearing the accusations from Peter causes each one of them to fall dead on the spot. While Peter acknowledges that they were under no obligation to donate the money, Peter takes issue with the couple's deceit for personal gain. They look generous, but they are giving for the sake of status, not of genuine love. Their lie is seen by Peter as a lie to the Holy Spirit and to God.

While I do not believe God intentionally brings death to those who deceive, and the couple's fate appears to be out of proportion for their sin, I see Ananias and Sapphira as important symbols of the dangers that false generosity can have on the identity of the Christian love-of-neighbor community. Their story is a serious reminder of the stakes we face every day when we make a commitment to serve Christ. Ananias and Sapphira's deceit occurred in the realm of money, but deceit can occur in other forms as it relates to our lives as Christians. In Jesus' teachings, our relationships with people are inseparable from our relationship with God. It is our Christian obligation to ensure that our actions towards others are motivated by
