### "I'M IN" - LIKE DUCKY AND HOTS

In May, my mother, Elizabeth "Ducky" Gower, died at age 94. In October, my friend Clarence "Hots" Easley died at age 93. Much of what I know about how to love, care for and give to others I learned from watching, living and working with these two stalwarts of our church. If I could put their pictures on the Harbinger cover, there would be nothing else to say. I would ask you to study their lives.

Coincidentally, these two pillars of WPC each joined this fledgling congregation around 1954. By all accounts, Mom (as was often substantiated by my loquacious father) and Hots (who loved discussing history, especially his own) embraced an array of church activities, adored the minister and gave talents and money enthusiastically. Both fully lived our stewardship theme – "I'm in."

There were other similarities. They were each caring and attentive professionals. They smiled and spoke to everyone. In fact, most people assumed Mom and Hots truly remembered them because they connected with all people and spent time getting to know them. They were lavish in their affection, generous in their giving and parsimonious on themselves. Mom's idea of an extravagant vacation was to spend a weekend in a cabin in North Carolina for a social work retreat. And for many years, Hots preferred medical mission trips to a primitive African hospital for several weeks at a time.

Death ends a life but not a relationship. In the case of Mom and Hots, their inspiring legacies live on today in their lasting relationships with God, family, friends, and our church.

Like Ducky and Hots, "I'm in." Join us.
