# the **HARBINGER** WESTMINSTER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Often, adults take for granted the lessons we learn as children. For the most part, we can choose where we live, what we do, and how we interact with the world around us. Stories from Sunday School are vaguely applied to our adult life, and we unconsciously lose sight of the awesomeness of their significance. It is almost as if when we are children we cannot truly grasp the profound meaning of these lessons, and as adults we simply forget them.

'Turn the other cheek,' 'The Golden Rule'... dare I say, 'Karma?' These familiar, catchphrase philosophies certainly cross my mind when I read Luke 6:27-38. I find myself torn between how familiar this passage is, and yet, how it almost seems too much to ask - childlike. So much so, it is full of modern-day idioms: to give the shirt off your back. If I boil it all down to a comfortable, inspirational story for children, it becomes a good idea, instead of a very clear directive from the Creator of the Universe. It becomes so tempting to cling to concepts that I think will make me feel better, rather than confront my own cognitive dissonance. Freedom comes in forgiveness, not from fearfully held grudges.

During my time as a student at Wofford, I struggled almost daily with a paralyzing fear that I was gay. Panic attacks were brought on by constant reminders from my childhood church that I was living in unrepentant sin. I was even told that I would be publicly excommunicated if I did not repent and change my orientation. I wrestled, seeking wise counsel from my pastor and elders, only to be told that this part of my identity would cut me off from the community of faith that had once taught me about grace, mercy, redemption, and love. I wanted to hate the people causing the pain and panic attacks; but something inside me resisted rancor. How could I ask for them to accept me, if I refused to afford them the same grace and mercy? How could I claim to know God's love and purpose, if I refused to love and forgive His creation? I was forced to confront my avoidance of Christ's clear directive and accept the minor role I could play in preserving life: my own, and that of other LGBTQ+ Christians struggling with the same feelings of hatred and hopelessness. In the still, small moments of my struggle, the Holy Spirit was revealing to me what Joseph came to know in Genesis 45:8, "it was not you who sent me here, but God..."
