On this Transfiguration of the Lord Sunday, we find ourselves with two wellknown scenes from Scripture. First, we see Moses coming down from Mount Sinai with the Ten Commandments in hand and, later, we see the moment when Jesus reveals his divinity during a mountaintop meeting with Moses and Elijah. I find myself struck by the similarity in appearances of Moses and Jesus and what this reveals to us about these pivotal moments. Moses, whose face "shone because he had been talking with God" and Jesus, whose "clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning," have literally been transformed, or transfigured in the case of Jesus, by their encounter with God. Moreover, the impact of these encounters is visible to those who witness these events. In a recent Sunday School class at Westminster led by the Rev. Dr. Peter Hobbie, we discussed the many different characteristics of God's love. Today's passages remind me of one of those qualities: initiating. God makes the first move in letting us know that a universal and unconditionally loving relationship awaits us. How does God initiate this relationship today? I can think of moments in my life where the brightness of the people and things around me have been a clear sign of God's desire for a relationship with me. I've seen it in... ... the laughing faces of my children each day when they get home from school. ... the dazzling rays of sunlight breaking through the clouds after a late-afternoon summer thunderstorm in Montreat. ... the brilliant blue eyes of a dear mentor and friend from my college years. ... the cheerful yellow daffodils that have made an earlier-than-expected arrival to our backyard this year. ... the beaming smile of my grandmother as I visited her for the last time in her hospital room near the end of her battle with a debilitating illness.



... the vivid red paraments announcing the Installation of our new Senior Pastor. Like all of us, I too often get caught up in the business of life. I cling steadfastly to my fears and uncertainties. I allow vanity and pride to guide my actions. Because of this, I am thankful for these hard-to-miss reminders of the message revealed to us in the brightness of the Transfiguration: through Jesus Christ, we all have access to God's perfect love and grace.
