THE ART OF LISTENING

One of the casualties of this Cyber Age has been the art of listening. When was the last time we truly listened to one another?

Listening is so much more than being still and quiet. It is a state of mind, one that can be easily disrupted by the noise of the 21st century. When was the last time we truly sat down, opened our hearts and listened to someone? Earbuds, cell phones, multimedia presentations that can be at our fingertips in seconds all form a cone of noise that can wipe out our ability to listen, to relate, to heal one another.

The news media, of which I was a member for more than 25 years, doesn't help the art of listening with its never-ending news cycle and the shows covering the political spectrum that devolve into shouting, finger-pointing or name-calling.

So what does God try to teach us about listening? Interestingly, a passage from the fourth chapter in 2 Timothy paints an accurate picture of our current dilemma.

"For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths."

2 Timothy 4:3-4

Amazing how words written more than a millennia ago can speak to us so clearly. Then there's this from later in the New Testament.

"You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness. Therefore rid yourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls."

James 1:19-21

Jesus points the way in one of the most familiar passage from Matthew.

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Matthew 11:28-30

One of the profound points of this passage is to assume a humble posture. Humbleness begets gentleness, and gentleness begets an open heart, and an open heart begets listening. And from listening we find understanding and the will to do God's work. May we all strive to be humble.
