Recently Anna and I had the opportunity to see the Broadway musical Come From Away while it made its run through Greenville at the Peace Center. It is the story of the people on the inbound transatlantic flights that landed on a small island in Newfoundland, Canada the morning of September 11. Coincidentally, I had just read this week's New Testament reading from Philippians 4 the day

The musical tells the story of these passengers from all cultures being stranded on an island, literally doubling the population of Gander, Newfoundland. This would be an inconvenience now, but much worse before Facebook instantly connected us to our loved ones.

One group of passengers portrayed is foreigners who spoke no English. Imagine being in their shoes—landing unexpectedly in a destination far from home, sitting on a plane on the tarmac for hours, and then being shuffled out like cattle. As an American in Canada, the stress in a situation like this would be overbearing; as a non-English speaker then, the anxiety would be crippling. But one of the community members quickly sees the family is carrying a Bible. He opens to Philippians 4 and points to verse 6: "Do not worry."

When I was growing up, this verse seemed like it was often brought up as a reminder for me not to worry, but to pray and worship. But now I read it from the other's perspective where I put myself in the shoes of the community of Canadians welcoming scared strangers.

They ended that scene with the group singing the Prayer of St Francis:

Make me a channel of your peace. Where there's despair in life let me bring hope. Where there is darkness, only light, and where there's sadness ever joy.
