It's May now and the weather is wonderful. The birds and bees are in the air, and the deluge of pollen is over. We can walk outside and see nature in full bloom, quite literally. The other day I was early with my morning routine, so I sat on the back porch for a few spare minutes before work. As my neighbors can tell you, our back yard is not the best manicured yard on the street. The grass is always a mess, ever since we've had two dogs to tear it up. (Some say the problem goes back further than that.) I noticed weeds that need pulling, hedges that need trimming and paint on the garage that needs refreshing. And yet somehow it was all perfect. The air was cool, the early sunlight was streaming down and nature was all around, perfect in its imperfection, weeds and all. It was a scene and a moment that reminded me how beautiful the world can be, and how thankful we should be for it. It seemed, at that moment, the countenance of the Lord was shining upon me.



In church as in life, some things make more sense than others. I always appreciated the straightforward words of the Doxology: "Praise God from whom all blessings flow ... " That's a good line. It's easy to understand, and it rhymes just right when you sing the whole thing out. The benediction on the other hand always confused me. When I was a kid, our pastor read it to include the phrase "...may the Lord make his countenance to shine upon you...." Many years passed before I knew what a "countenance" was. And even then it was confusing. I mean, if I can't see God's face, how would I know if it was shining upon me?

And if I still don't know precisely what that means, that's also perfect. Some things are true and real and right, even if we don't fully understand them. I think maybe the Lord wants it to be that way.
