Through the years, I held onto a considerable chunk of my childhood memorabilia. From station to station, I carried along a cardboard box of important things. The box was irregularly ordered with evidence of athletic achievements, report cards, random correspondence, photos of prom dates and soccer teams, newspaper clippings, a poem that was once published in a magazine, programs from graduations and ceremonies I had attended. All the good days, never the bad.

In the way people today catalogue, or at least curate, their lives through Instagram, Facebook, and the like, I had curated the early part of mine in a box that I kept in the attic. Recently, I threw the box and its contents in the trash.

It was time. Past time. No time right or wrong, but just time. There was no vanity for me in these belongings, apart from their being a record of my existence. Existence, of course, being its own vanity. But as I unceremoniously dumped them into the trash bin, it occurred to me that I, alone, and no one other than me, was even capable of caring about the collective contents of that box. I had been the only one. And at that moment, I was no longer.

It is said that the universe, all of creation, is no small thing. It is said that it goes on forever. It is said that somehow through tricks with time and space, the universe not only goes on forever, but is also constantly expanding. It only took the vacuousness of a curbside trash bin to swallow up evidence of a considerable portion of my existence. In Psalm 8, the psalmist asks God, "What are human beings that you are mindful of them."
