THANKS WILL NEVER BE ENOUGH, SO PAY IT FORWARD

First responders are vital in our lives. They help us in times of extreme need, a reassuring presence when our world is turned upside down. They save lives every day in ways big and small, and we are grateful.

For me, the "first responder" who saved my life starting 23 years ago was the Rev. Barbara Stoop. Many at Westminster know that my wife Elaine died in the autumn of 1996. But few know the role Barb played in saving my life, my daughter's life and – by extension - the life I now cherish with Kathy and our son Robby.

It was Barb who counseled our seven-year-old daughter Rachel in the days leading up to Elaine's passing at Duke University Medical Center.

After learning of Elaine's death on the morning of Oct. 30, 1996, Barb - who was good friends with my wife – somehow found the strength to soldier through It's Elementary that afternoon ... with Rachel in attendance. Barb never let the children sense what terrible

It was Barb who staved with Rachel at church as I drove back from Durham. With Barb at my side. I told our little girl that Mommy had gone to heaven and wasn't coming back. From that point, Barb was a constant and soothing presence in our lives. A few weeks after Elaine's death, Barb and her sons Matt and Charlie helped us decorate our Christmas tree, a task that was more heart-wrenching than it sounds.

Barb helped Rachel and me cope with the loss, shining a light where none seemed possible. Throughout 1997 and much of 1998, our families bonded over meals, movies

All the while, Barb was spreading the Gospel of God's love with humility, grace and devotion. She - along with Lud, Jean and the late Dan Hughs - helped me grow closer to Christ and opened my heart to God's wondrous gifts. I became a Sunday school teacher, a middle school youth group counselor and a session member.

As surely as if she had dashed into a burning building, Barb Stoop saved me. To this day, she is a spiritual advisor, confidante and close friend.

How does anyone repay such a debt? Well, no one can. But in Isaiah 55:10-13, the author tells us that the spiritual seeds we spread are a memorial to God's grace and love. Barb Stoop has been a joyful sower throughout her ministry, and we at Westminster have reaped mightily from her love and devotion. As Barb steps away, let us show our gratitude

by paying it forward thereby sowing more seeds so that God's kingdom will flourish. Mark Matlock
