

BEING HUMBLE

In today's world, we have YouTube stars and the Instagram famous. These are people that are finding "success" by focusing on and promoting themselves. They are not alone. We are all told that to get ahead, we need to be noticed, to acquire accolades and awards, and to try and win. Technology has created methods to quantify and track our success by tallying our likes, re-tweets and followers and tracking the growth of these numbers can be addictive. Additionally, many of our careers depend on attracting new customers or clients, which is done through net-working, advertising and promoting ourselves and what it is that we do well. None of this is necessarily bad; however, it inherently focuses our intention on ourselves and it can eclipse our engagement with God and others.

In today's scripture lesson, Jesus, through the parable of the banquet seating, tells of the virtue of being humble, of taking the worst seat rather than the seat next to the host where the guest will be noticed. A central message here is that we need to humble ourselves to God and acknowledge that we do not know all and to be open to his teachings and messages. Another key message of this scripture is to put others before ourselves. And while this sounds right, and on a gut level feels right, it does not spell out how we put others before ourselves.

In my readings about humbleness, several themes emerged. One is that the humble person believes that all humans have inherent value; you are not any more important that the person next to you. As an example, the humble leader will listen to others and will openly accept the ideas of their followers that are better than the leader's own ideas. They don't stubbornly insist that it be done their way. Another theme is that the humble person seeks to spotlight and lift up others. Many people, when reflecting on the success they have had in life, will recognize the support and encouragement of a friend, teacher, mentor, or parent. Being humble really does take many forms.

While the value of being humble seems clear both in our relationship with God and others, and there are many studies that have established that humble people are happier, more stable and, paradoxically, very successful, it is not necessarily easy to focus or maintain our attention on others. As a matter of fact, to do so is to push against what society is telling us we must do to get ahead. Also, it requires us to check our ego, the very ego that is getting built up through our acquisition of awards, accolades, likes and follows, and appreciate the value of others. It is not an easy road to follow. However, remembering the words of C.S. Lewis can be a useful, simple tool to guide us in our efforts, "Humility is not thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less."
