As we look at the world in 2019, there is trouble afoot. The misguided conviction that "our side" alone can find the answers; every issue turned into a binary choice; the hatred that spews from so many angles; it just seems so overwhelming. Unfortunately, that has led to grudges flourishing. In the past, the word "grudge" held a negative meaning. We knew we shouldn't hold grudges or seek retribution. Today some see grudges as a means to an end, and revenge as a cul-de-sac of comfort, not a dead-

In darker moments, I know I have pondered revenge or retribution over either real or perceived slights. But what good really comes of that? There may be a momentary rush of satisfaction, but then we are left with the empty feeling knowing that we have failed to adhere to Jesus' teachings, that we have failed to forgive.

And some of the greatest of Jesus' teachings are revealed in the Beatitudes. They are one of Christianity's cornerstones. They are meant to be a guide in difficult times or "very present help in trouble," as it is written in Psalm 46.

> "Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

I think what the Beatitudes call us to do is to let go. Let go of ill feelings, embrace mercy; let go of urges, seek a pureness of heart; let go of grudges, try to make peace. They are a call for forgiveness.

It sounds so simple, and yet so complex when we are in the maelstrom of our everyday world. But imagine - not if we achieved what Christ points us toward but if we simply try. Try to be merciful, try to be pure in heart, try to make peace,

What a wonderful world that could be.
