Jack, my 2 year old, is learning to share. "That's mine!" is a phrase we hear often. "Mine!" He says when he takes his truck back. "It's mine," he says with a poked out lower lip when a friend is playing with something he would rather have himself.

What he's really saying is, "That belongs to me. It's of use to me. It's of value to me."

Learning to share – and frankly teaching a child to share – isn't easy business. It seems to me that it would be so much easier not to. Certainly, life seems to be easier when my time, my talent, my money is just that – mine.

I'm reminded of the boy with the loaves and fishes in the Gospel. That food belonged to him. Maybe he'd gone to the market on his family's behalf to buy bread and had caught two fish to supplement their needs. Why on earth would he give that away? And if we're honest, what kind of an impact would his couple of fish and his five loaves have on a crowd of 5,000 anyway? Wouldn't it be more useful to his family? After all, it belonged to them.

What we know is his small gift was blessed and multiplied. We know that the community around him was fed until they were full – and there were leftovers!

When we share, when we give away those things that belong to us, we are enriched by the fullness of our community. We see this at Westminster through our mission work both at home through organizations like United Ministries and The Family Effect to our mission work abroad in the DR and Malawi to the place where Jack learns most to share - Westminster Weekday School.

In this season where you are asked to reflect on what and how you and your family give what "belongs" to you, consider the ways that your belongings will be blessed and multiplied in this community that you belong to.
