science is in agreement with our faith tradition on the importance of In the mid 1950's, American psychologist, Abraham Maslow, published ny of Needs and identified the need to belong as one of our five basic f-actualization - right up there with our need for food and water and safety and security. Belonging is not merely desirable, says social essential to our very survival.

decades later, medical science has now weighed in on the importance g. Through the use of functional MRI's, neuroscientists are now able to human brain's reaction to social rejection and isolation. We now know person experiences social rejection or loses their sense of belonging, in the brain activate and are illuminated on MRI images. These are in centers that activate when we stub our toe or burn ourselves with So when we say "he hurt my feelings" or "she broke my heart" or "it to be alone" we are not simply speaking metaphorically but rather ribing actual symptoms of our painful condition.

There is no doubt that we are wired for connection. We really do need to belong. At Westminster, as we begin our stewardship campaign, we continue seeking to be that place where all can belong - where we can all plug in, make meaningful contributions, be ourselves, speak our minds, worship our loving God together, all while feeling valued and loved. We aim to be that place where each and every one of us truly belongs.
