

ALL EYES

The wait was interminable. One delay after another turned what should've been a short stay in the Charlotte airport into a 12-hour field trip/ordeal. It was to be the first leg of a spring break tour of Italy. Instead, the group of 32 souls was back in Greenville after midnight

Some who face that sort of inconvenience would lose it, moaning and groaning the whole way, taking a woe-is-me attitude and getting snarly and snarky. But the adults knew that there were 24 pairs of student eyes watching them, and the adults also knew any sign of discontent or poor attitude would've been witnessed by those students (and in today's digital environment, any bad behavior might've been on Snapchat or Instagram faster than you can say "arrivederci").

What those adults realized is something we sometimes forget: our actions set crystal clear examples for our children. They emulate our behavior, good or bad. So it's incumbent upon us as parents and role models to make sure we are aware of how we act.

Jesus addresses this in his Sermon on the Mount.

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket but on the lampstand and it gives light to all the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16

Our children, no matter their age, look to us for guidance and strength. If we say one thing but act in the opposite manner, children pick up on that. Those inconsistencies can confuse them possibly at an important juncture of their lives. Robert Fulghum, author of "All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten," once wrote: "Don't worry that children never listen to you; worry that they always are watching you."

Let's make sure our children's eyes see what they need to build a better world through God's Word and our actions.

ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

We at Westminster believe that education is essential for discipleship, and hope that what you learn in this place will transform your living beyond our doors. Our "January Term," taught this year by members of Westminster, kicks off this **Sunday**, **January 6**, and will run each Sunday through **January 27**.

1. A Medieval Primer: Saints, purgatory, piety and the legacy of a different world

This class provides a brief historical overview of Christian beliefs and practices during the Middle Ages (c. 500-c. 1500). Some of the major topics include: saints' relics and pilgrimages, the doctrine of purgatory, monks and monasticism, and late medieval daily piety. This lecture-based class places religious trends in their social and cultural contexts and thus focuses more on the beliefs of regular people than on scholastic debates of highly-educated theologians.

Teacher: Caroline Clark is an Associate Professor at Clemson University

specializing in the medieval period in Europe with a particular focus on women's roles and social networks in medieval England..

2. The Gospel Stories: Why Four Points of View?

Based on Steven L. Bridges's book, <u>Getting the Gospels: Understanding the New Testament Accounts of Jesus' Life</u>, we will learn together what these four stories can teach us about Jesus' life and our mission.

3. The Flock: Sabbath

This discussion-based class, geared primary toward folks in their 40sand 50s, will focus on the concept of "Sabbath" as laid out by popular author and theologian Walter Brueggemann in <u>Sabbath as Resistance</u>. Participants will explore our 24/7 society of consumption, a society in which we live to achieve, accomplish, perform, and possess, and ask how we can begin to focus on a restored relationship with God and our community.

Teachers: Ben Alexander, Christa Likes, LeAnne White are each active

in various ministries of Westminster. Ben has served on the Weekday School Committee. Christa has served on the Membership Committee. LeAnne is Moderator Elect for Presbyterian Women.

4. Playing the Back Nine: Aging in the Modern World

The class will explore issues relevant to aging: navigating healthcare, care giving, spirituality, and theories about age.
