"This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him." John 2:11

Jesus, his mother Mary, and his disciples attended a wedding in Cana of Galilee. During the festivities, the wine ran out and Mary makes this known to her son. Jesus reacts on his mother's words and tells the servants to fill six stone jugs to the brim with water. He chooses these containers as opposed to the empty wine pots available as an act of symbolism for a variety of reasons. These jugs were carved from stone, not made from clay, and would have been much larger than anything else. They were able to hold several gallons of liquid. Their purpose would have been used in ceremonial cleansings by the Jews. These jugs would have been consecrated for holy purposes, and their use here reiterates the lesson that we all are vessels of the Lord. Jesus telling the servants to fill the jugs to the brim symbolizes that nothing more can be added and nothing more can be done.

Once filled, he directed them to take the jugs to the master of the banquet. The master of the banquet tasted what had become wine and exclaimed to the bridegroom, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you saved the best till now!" The master of the banquet nor the wedding party ever realized where the wine came from, but the servants who had drawn the water realized what occurred. It was his disciples that realized they had witnessed a miracle, his first.

Jesus performed this act to prove his real nature to his disciples. The purpose of this miracle was to reveal his glory and in turn, bring faith to him from the disciples. Jesus was not interested in drawing attention or receiving faith from the master of the banquet or those attending the wedding. Even though the servants knew what had occurred, Jesus did not perform the miracle to gain their faith. His only reasoning to perform the act was to reveal his true, inner being to his disciples. The miracle achieved its purpose, for his disciples believed in him.
