



QUESTIONS OF FAITH • Art & Faith

Today's Harbinger Cover is a commission by John Blair Hartman, III

CREATED ESPECIALLY FOR OUR YOUTH GROUP IN 2019 AND 2020.

This year's youth ministry theme is "Questions of Faith." At our back to school retreat at Look Up Lodge in August of 2019, over 100 youth submitted questions they wrestle with as people of faith. These questions have been used to guide our Sunday night youth group discussions and lessons and they have opened our minds and hearts to how God might be speaking to us today. We invite all worshippers into this space of questioning with us today. Be sure to check out our exciting art installations in the Atrium. The posters hanging from the ceiling are original works of art, based on the questions we have studied this year. They were commissioned by Westminster from artist Blair Hartman. The question marks spanning the space were made by both youth groups on Sunday, January 26th as part of a devotion on Jonah. May you feel the Holy Spirit's movement through our senior reflections, adapted and original liturgy, and powerful music choices.

"Requiem" • Notes on the Anthem

A note on today's anthem, Eliza Gilkyson's "Requiem."

Requiem was written by American folk-singer and lyricist Eliza Gilkyson in response to the the devastating Indian Ocean earthquake and tsunami of 2004. The tsunami left over 230,000 dead and displaced many more. Moved by immediate and global grief, Gilkyson addressed "Requiem" to Mary, a figure common in many faith communities. Traditional requiems (sung during Catholic masses for the dead) often utilize Mary as a central conversation partner. However Gilkyson sought a more universal "mary," a woman who could stand in as a bearer and transformer of grief, a figure who heard the cries of the living and the dead. Gilkyson's original poetry, as reflected in this text, intentionally does not capitalize "mother mary" to indicate inclusivity for all who turn to their beliefs in times of sorrow. By doing so, Gilkyson acknowledged that a global event such at this tsunami has an effect on all of God's creation, not simply one segment and one religion. This youth Sunday, as we ask questions of faith, this anthem helps us voice strength in community, comfort in grief, and the assurance of divine presence in our sorrow.
