I have a four-year-old who knows how to push my buttons. And unfortunately, patience is not one of my strongest virtues. I'm working on it. I'm not proud of it but sometimes I snap in irritation, and sometimes I even yell, and sometimes, as a consequence, there are tears.

What strikes me, as I contemplate Paul's and Matthew's interpretations of Jesus's command to reconcile, is how quickly my daughter forgives me. And she not only forgives, but she forgets. Five minutes later we will be driving down the road, with me silently berating myself for being impatient with her again, but she will pipe up with a question: "What kind of airplane is that in the sky, Mommy?" "When can we go to Donkey Donuts again?" "Did you know that I found a dragon's egg today, Mommy?" While I have been silently fretting about my sins in the front seat, she has moved on, accepted, and forgiven me with all of her heart. No anger, no grudges, just forgiveness and pure reconciliation.

This makes me contemplate whether there are grudges that I hold on to, or comments or actions that I have not forgiven. With any of my loved ones, neighbors, or colleagues, have I perhaps moved on in words or deeds, but not fully in my heart?

Be reconciled to one another, as Jesus teaches in the Sermon on the Mount. Be reconciled to God, as Paul writes to the Corinthians. This extends not only to childparent relationships but to romantic partners, neighbors, legal adversaries, and even those with views from the other side of the political aisle. I believe that it also applies to ourselves. Now, while I will still try to be more patient, or at the very least express my impatience aloud less frequently (because I will still worry that these minor altercations may add up to affect my daughter's psychological well-being), I do believe that Paul is allowing us the grace to be forgiving of ourselves. "Everything has become new!" he writes. Continuing, "in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them." We can begin again each day, and if we can let go of our grudges, forgive and forget with our whole hearts the way my four-year-old seems to do, there will be less room for hurt, pain, and anger. Our hearts will instead offer space for the light and love Jesus wants us to find, nurture, and extend out into the world.
